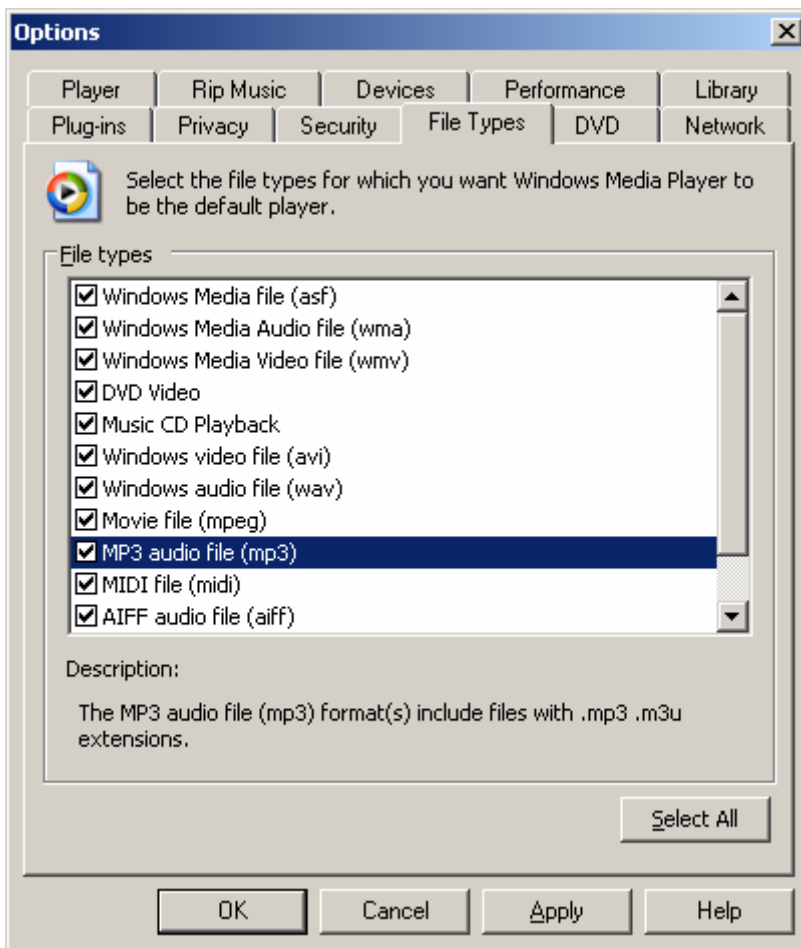


If you listen online, the audio should start to play within 10 seconds (with DSL or cable Modem). If you need to wait for more than several minutes, your media player's setting maybe incorrect. Follow instructions below to correct it:

If Microsoft Windows Media Player is installed on your computer

If you are running Windows XP or newer, most likely you already have Windows Media Player 9 or above installed on your computer. You need to make sure it is the default player for mp3 files. To do that, follow the steps below

1. Launch Windows Media Player (you can find it under All Programs >> Accessories >> Entertainment).
2. Go to Windows Media Player menu, under Tools >> Options, and select the "File Type" tab. Make sure MP3 Audio file is selected. If it is already selected, you can unselect it and then select it again. Click the "Apply" button to apply changes.



If Microsoft Windows Media Player is NOT installed on your computer

Install Windows Media Player version 9 or higher version. You can find the Windows Media Player installation easily by doing a search with key words “Windows Media Player download”. During the installation, select it to be the default media player for mp3 files.
